Dr Phil Meadows is an ordained presbyter in the British Methodist Church. He was lecturer in theology and religious studies at Westminster College, Oxford, before spending six years as E. Stanley Jones Professor of Evangelism at Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary, near Chicago, in the USA. He is currently lecturer in Missiology and Wesleyan Studies at Cliff College, Derbyshire. Phil's research and publication interests combine theology, spirituality and discipleship in the Wesleyan tradition with the missionary challenges of contemporary culture. He is also a co-founder and director of the Inspire Network, which is an ecumenical movement seeking to resource mission-shaped discipleship in the leadership and life of the church. In his spare time, he loves to be in the countryside walking, running, and riding his bicycle.

Sam Meadows is gifted in pastoral and evangelistic ministry. In addition to being a full time mum, she has served as Community Pastor at Holmebrook Valley Church, and is part of the Eldership Team, with special responsibilities for oversight of children's ministry.
