Create a Scene Adam and Eve

Make Adam or Eve out of the clay. Use the tools/implements provided to add the finer details such as hands, feet, facial features, hair, etc. Use tools to make impressions in the clay. Try to make your figure unique.



Then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground and breathed life into his nostrils, the breath of life and the man became a living being. **Genesis 2: 7**

As you work, imagine God making the Adam out of the dust of the earth!

Make the story Junk animals

Use the materials provided to make an animal of your choice. You can use some of the ideas available or come up with a creation of your own.



Have a Wow moment

Think for a moment about all the living creatures, the bugs, the fish, the birds, the reptiles, the mammals and remember that God created them all just by speaking. Isn't that amazing?

Play with the Story Mammals Birds and Bugs

Take a game sheet and have a go at naming a mammal, a bird and a bug starting with each letter. Ask a leader to time you to see how quickly you can finish the game. You can ask around for help if you get stuck. If you want to beat your time, try again with a different game sheet. There are 4 to choose from.

For example if the letter was h the answers could be:


There are around 6,400 different kinds of mammals, around 10,000 different kinds of birds in the world.

Build the story Paper chain snake

Use some scrap A4 paper that is clean on one side. Cut it in half lengthways. Take a black marker and draw some patterns on the paper. Colour the patterns in. Try using strong colours for detail and light colours for the background.

Make a group paper chain snake. Add your patterned paper through another one and stick with a glue stick. To make the head, use one of the patterned strips and fold in half. With scissors, cut the non-folded end into a rounded shape. Add a big forked tongue and googly eyes.





Explore the story Indoor rainbows

Place a mirror into a bowl at an angle. You may want to tape or stick it in place. Fill the bowl about half full of water so that half the mirror is submerged. Using a torch shine light into the water where the mirror is under water. Hold a sheet of white paper above the mirror; adjust the angle until you see the rainbow appear!

What is going on

When you shine the white light of your torch into the water, the light bends. But white light isn't just one colour, it's a combination of all the visible colours. So, when white light bends, all its components (red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and indigo light) also bend. Each of these colours bends at a different angle because each colour travels at a different speed inside water or glass.



Design the story 3D Rainbow

Use the materials provided to design a 3D rainbow that can stand up alone.

You can use some of the ideas available or come up with a creation of your own.



The rainbow was God's covenant that he would never flood the earth again.

(covenant means promise or agreement)

Genesis 9 v 14-16

Whenever I bring clouds over the earth and the rainbow appears in the clouds, ¹⁵I will remember my covenant between me and you and all living creatures of every kind. Never again will the waters become a flood to destroy all life. ¹⁶Whenever the rainbow appears in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and all living creatures of every kind on the earth."
