Story Circle On the Road to Damascus

Everyone stands in a circle. Divide the group in half, one half mimes along to the first part of the story while the other half watches, and then they swap over. If your group is small you might just want to allow everyone to mime along to all of the story. Explain that they can do their own actions and also watch and join in with the actions of others.

A leader narrates and leads the children by doing some actions to help give them ideas. Any leaders present should join in enthusiastically to encourage the children to get involved. The words in bold could be accompanied by actions.
